

## Is My Child on Track for a Good ACT/SAT Score?

### *What MAP (RIT) Scores Can Tell You: A One Page Guide*

**Step 1:** Learn about the ACT or SAT scores that are required to be admitted at different colleges and universities. You can do that at:

This site provides you with the average SAT and ACT scores for different schools, and with the scores for the 25<sup>th</sup> and 75<sup>th</sup> percentile of the entering freshman class.

For example, at the University of Colorado/Boulder, the average ACT scores is 26, while the 25<sup>th</sup> percentile score is 24 and the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile score is 29.

**Step 2:** NWEA (the organization that produces the MAP Assessments) provides the following table showing fall and spring MAP scores for a student who is on-track to score a 24 on the ACT Reading and Math Assessments. Unfortunately, that is the highest ACT score for which they produce these tables. A 24 on the ACT is equal to a 550 on the SAT Critical Reading test, and a 560 on the SAT Math test.

-- and SAT 560 in Math
